The first individual has 22 been a dedicated public servant of the Township of

Lyons for many years. He has successfully served four terms in office. I'm not seeing him.

Mr. Thomas Garrette, where are you at? Tom Garrette standing here. If we can give Tom some recognition.

(Round of applause.)

SUPERVISOR GETTY: For 16 years Tom Garrette faithfully served as the Township Trustee. I don't think there was ever a meeting I ever recall him missing. Very dedicated to his duties. And he's done just a fantastic job. He decided not to run for another term. I know if he would have run, he would have been reelected.

But we wish you the absolute best in your future endeavors, Tom.

TRUSTEE GARRETTE: Thank you.

SUPERVISOR GETTY: The next individual I'd like to draw some attention to is a predecessor of mine, also served as the township supervisor in the Township of Lyons. After serving as township supervisor, he went on to become a judge in the Cook County court system and successfully did that for many years. In 2020, he

decided to retire. And I want to honor the former supervisor, former judge of Cook County, Mr. Pat Rogers, everyone.

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(Round of applause.)

5 SUPERVISOR GETTY: I'll give you the floor, your 6 Honor.

MR. PAT ROGERS: My name is Pat Rogers, R-o-g-e-r-s, 4919 Woodland, Western Springs.

I learned a couple of lessons this evening, folks. If Mayor Getty or Mike decide to tell you to show up a little early, I would advise you to show up a little early. When I got here, they told me I was going to make a couple of comments about some elected officials, and I thanked them profusely for giving me enough of time to prepare.

I, too, want to recognize Tom Garrette. He served on a board that I was the supervisor for a number of years. Was always a reliable vote once you were able to explain exactly what it was you were attempting to accomplish. He did serve the residents of the Township of Lyons extremely well. I missed him when I left the board. And I want to personally thank

him for his support while I was there.

So thank you very much, Tom. Thank you.

(Round of applause.)

MR. PAT ROGERS: Now, I was also asked to speak about another candidate who is near and dear to my heard, and that is Assessor Barbara Weyrick who has announced that she was not seeking re-election this last election. Barb was with the Township since 1989, and she and I met probably in 1990 when we were trying to get together a combined slate, and that was the first time that the township had attempted to do that under one-party banner.

And that was interesting because for those of you who are not familiar with the township government, unlike other local governments where you run staggered terms, in other words, if you have six trustees, three run in one two-year stance and then three run in the other, so you always have a little bit of continuity.

Township government does not work that way.

And in 1992, when we were elected, other than Barb

Weyrick as the assessor, there was no continuity at

all. And although the transition was somewhat

seamless, we relied on the folks that were there before us, Barb Weyrick and the township attorney, Ed King.

So Barb and I were campaigning, going to find out exactly where those 17 towns were at, and with regards to those LaGrange Highlands, it's pretty important for folks that are running for office to understand, there's 6,000 -- or there were 6,000; I can't tell you tonight how many there are -- but there were 6,000 votes in that unincorporated area. You couldn't win the township without that area, but you could lose it if you didn't have it. So it's important for that area to produce, and we were fortunate enough to do it.

Now, Barb Weyrick has served over at Lyons

Township first as the deputy assessor, employee, then

deputy assessor, under, I think his name was Vince

McInerney, if I recall correctly; and then she ran and

wound up being the township assessor.

And for those of you that are not familiar with township government, each of those elected officials are elected officials that are in control and

responsible for their various budgets. And Barb, although I went to law school, was very astute on a case that emanated out of Lyons Township, which was Painter versus the Township of Lyons in which the appellate court ruled that the assessor's office had the right and the freedom and the responsibility to conduct business on its own.

When Barb, not that she needed that support, but once she had that legal support, she never once, never once in all of the years that I was out there, ever hesitated to come in and let me know, number one, she was the assessor, but, number two, more importantly, this is what needed to be done and this was the legal responsibility.

So that was a lesson that I learned fairly early in my career as supervisor. And I can tell you tonight as I stand here, never once again did she have to come in and let me know that. I took it to my heart, and I listened to what she said, because she had the responsibility to do it.

With regard to how she conducted business in that office, Barb had everyone that came in that office

sign in and that was the name that she had. She had a list. She had a wonderful list of folks that had visited the township. And based upon the fact that she always had an outstanding staff with her, most, not all because you're dealing with property taxes, but most folks that walked out of there were convinced they were served properly, they were happy with the results, and then those folks were contacted later on, sometimes two years, sometimes four years depending, and it probably was the most reliable list of folks that we made an effort, a concerted effort to contact.

As a result of her success in doing that, I was fortunate enough to be reelected four times. I'm not quite sure I would have been elected the first time if it wasn't for Barb Weyrick. So personally I want to thank her for her support.

And I remember once when I was on the bench somebody had made a lengthy argument, and I said "brevity would be rewarded." So I'm going to make sure that I follow those rules tonight. Brevity will be rewarded. I just want to thank Barb for her service to the township. I love you. Good job. Thank you.

MODERATOR RODRIGUEZ: We move on to old business.

Under "Old Business," I would like to read into the record the advisory question of public policy which was placed on the November 3, 2020, general election ballot via Resolution 2020-12.

The advisory question states: "Shall the U.S. Congress pass legislation to place a carbon fee on fossil fuel producers, where the collected revenue is given equitably to American households, incentivizing businesses and consumers to reduce climate-disrupting emissions, encourage the transition to clean energy, and protect our economic well-being."

The advisory question of public policy was approved by the Township of Lyons electorally on November 3, 2020, voting "Yes," 33,077 to "No," 17,542.
