2 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Good evening, everyone.

3 Thank you very much for being in
4 attendance.

5 This is the Township of Lyons Board of
6 Trustees Regular Board Meeting.

7 The Annual Town Meeting will start
8 promptly at 7:00 o'clock.

9 With that being said, I call to order
10 the Board of Trustees Regular Town Meeting on
11 this Tuesday, April 14, 2026, at 6:00 o'clock
12 p.m.

13 Would everyone please rise for the
14 Pledge of Allegiance.

15 (Whereupon, the Pledge of
16 Allegiance was held.)

17 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Thank you very much.

18 Madam Clerk, please call the roll.

19 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Anderson?

20 TRUSTEE ANDERSON: Here.

21 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Cruz?

22 TRUSTEE CRUZ: Here.

23 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Imielski?

24 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: Here.

1 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Mares?

2 TRUSTEE MARES: Here.

3 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Supervisor Getty?

4 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Present.

5 Okay. Moving on to the approval of the
6 minutes, the Clerk has put together Item 4A on
7 the agenda, which is the March 24th, 2026 Board
8 of Trustees Regular Board Meeting Minutes.

9 Is there a motion to approve these
10 minutes as presented?

11 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: Move to approve.

12 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Trustee Imielski.

13 TRUSTEE CRUZ: I second.

14 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Trustee Cruz. Thank you.

15 All those in favor please say aye.

16 ALL PRESENT: Aye.

17 SUPERVISOR GETTY: All opposed?

18 (No response.)

19 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Those are approved at this
20 time. Thank you very much.

21 Moving to the Supervisor's Report, the
22 first item is 5A:

23 This is the approval of a \$750
24 sponsorship for the LaGrange School District

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1 No. 105 Dash supporting scholarship
2 opportunities to LaGrange School District 105
3 students pursuing college and/or trade schools.

4 We have been a sponsor of this
5 fundraiser in the past. It is a good cause, and
6 we're looking to continue our support.

7 Is there a motion to approve?

8 TRUSTEE ANDERSON: I'll make that motion to
9 approve.

10 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Trustee Anderson.

11 Is there a second?

12 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: I'll second.

13 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Trustee Imielski, thank
14 you.

15 Any comments or questions?

16 (No response.)

17 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Clerk, please call the
18 roll.

19 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Anderson?

20 TRUSTEE ANDERSON: Aye.

21 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Imielski?

22 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: Aye.

23 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Mares?

24 TRUSTEE MARES: I'm going to abstain. I sit

1 on that board. Is that appropriate?

2 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Abstain is fine.

3 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Cruz?

4 TRUSTEE CRUZ: Aye.

5 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Supervisor Getty?

6 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Yes.

7 It is approved. Thank you very much.

8 Next is 5B:

9 This is the approval of a \$500
10 sponsorship for the Kiwanis Club of LaGrange for
11 their Kiwanis "Breakfast & Beats" on Sunday,
12 May 3rd, 2026 at Helping Hand in Countryside.

13 This is an annual event that they do;
14 however, they just changed it up. They're
15 adding music to this event. And we're looking
16 to obviously raise ~~some~~ funds for the Kiwanis
17 Club.

18 Is there a motion to approve this
19 sponsorship for \$500?

20 TRUSTEE MARES: So moved. Kid-friendly
21 music, by the way, if you're listening. Bring
22 your kiddos.

23 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Yes, ma'am.

24 Trustee Mares made a motion. Is there

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1 a second?

2 TRUSTEE CRUZ: I'll second.

3 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Trustee Cruz, thank you.

4 Any comments or questions?

5 (No response.)

6 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Clerk, please call the
7 roll.

8 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Mares?

9 TRUSTEE MARES: Aye.

10 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Cruz?

11 TRUSTEE CRUZ: Aye.

12 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Imielski?

13 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: Aye.

14 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Anderson?

15 TRUSTEE ANDERSON: Aye.

16 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Supervisor Getty?

17 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Yes.

18 It is approved. Thank you very much.

19 Moving on to 5C:

20 This is the discussion of community
21 funds. This is budget line Item No. 30-700
22 regarding policy.

23 This came from discussions at the
24 budget level when we were deciding how much to

1 fund community relations. And also from, I
2 believe, citizen comments.

3 One of the trustees thought it would
4 make sense for us to put some policy around
5 expenditures, sponsorships, donations, outreach
6 events, and general community engagement
7 initiatives.

8 I'm going to defer to Trustee Mares.

9 TRUSTEE MARES: May I?

10 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Yes.

11 TRUSTEE MARES: So I did just want to evenly
12 distribute the amount of money over our 18
13 communities which would be actively about 3,300
14 per community annually. Anything above and
15 beyond would be discussed and voted.

16 And we just ~~broke~~ broke up the already funded
17 budget line item to be appropriate for this, and
18 as advised by counsel, separate out service
19 projects versus community donations.

20 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Yeah. Just to refresh
21 your memory, we had \$20,000 set aside for
22 service project initiatives and then \$60,000 for
23 community relations. The last two items that we
24 just approved at the board level, the \$750 and

1 \$500 sponsorships will both fall under the
2 community relations.

3 So looking to have discussion about
4 policy, and have this as consideration or
5 further discussion by the Board at a later date.

6 Any further comments or questions?

7 TRUSTEE ANDERSON: Thanks for bringing that.
8 It looks good.

9 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Please review that
10 document when you get a chance.

11 Nothing further for the Supervisor.

12 Moving on to the Clerk.

13 CLERK HOFFENBERG: We hosted Emissions
14 Testing in partnership with the Secretary of
15 State's office last week, and it was
16 tremendously, tremendously popular. We had
17 hundreds of cars that came through.

18 I had people who stopped me and said,
19 "This is the best thing that has come to our
20 community in years." So that was very well
21 received.

22 We have our Repair Cafe this Saturday,
23 this room, 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. We'll have
24 one or two knife sharpeners. Always popular.

1 Our AARP Safe Driver Course returns
2 April 28th and 29th from 10:00 to 2:00. We
3 always serve a lovely lunch.

4 Our Spring Shed Event is scheduled for
5 May 2nd here at the Township from 8:00 to noon.
6 We also have one in June in Bridgeview.

7 We are hosting our Flower Arranging
8 Class on April 30th. It hasn't quite been
9 pushed out publicly because it's extremely
10 popular and tends to fill up within an hour or
11 two of work getting out. So since you're in
12 attendance tonight, you have a special tip right
13 now.

14 We are also hosting our first ever
15 Earth Day Celebration. It's on Saturday, April
16 25th. It is called Discover the Magic of the
17 Prairie. It is at the Caboose at the Santa Fe
18 Prairie in Hodgkins. There will be a magician
19 at 1:30, and then there will be story time at
20 2:30. We're super-duper excited about that.

21 Finally, I just wanted to bring to the
22 Board's attention that we are starting our
23 summer internship program in six weeks
24 approximately. And it would be really great if

1 we could re-examine the idea of having a bottle
2 filler.

3 I know that I asked for that maybe a
4 year or two ago and we had one estimate that we
5 received. It would be great if we could have
6 that by the time the students begin, you know,
7 to really enhance the sustainability of the
8 township.

9 And it would probably be more
10 cost-effective in the long-run if we had people
11 just fill up bottles rather than keep taking our
12 water bottles.

13 TRUSTEE MARES: Yeah. And greener.

14 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Yeah.

15 TRUSTEE MARES: Agree. Can we have --

16 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Yeah. We've already
17 looked at it.

18 CLERK HOFFENBERG: That's all I've got.

19 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Okay. Thank you very
20 much, Clerk.

21 Assessor Hynes I know is working to get
22 here. I assume he'll be at the 7:00 o'clock
23 meeting.

24 Highway Commissioner Carr.

1 HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER CARR: Good evening. A
2 few things.

3 With all the rain here, the boys have
4 been working really hard on the ditch lines to
5 keep them flowing. It's been a nonstop project
6 with all the leaves that fell over right before
7 the snow fell. So they've been working pretty
8 hard on that.

9 Chipping started on the 1st. So
10 chipping is Monday and Tuesday moving forward to
11 the snowy season. And then the last thing is
12 the road project should be starting tomorrow,
13 weather permitting. If not, they'll push it
14 back a couple days. But it is scheduled to
15 start tomorrow.

16 And that's all we have over at the
17 highway department.

18 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Any questions for the
19 Highway Commissioner?

20 Hearing none.

21 Moving to finance. Trustee Imielski.

22 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: Thank you, Mr. Supervisor.

23 At this time, I make a motion to
24 approve spending for the Township.

1 We'll start with the General Town Fund,
2 and I'm going to move to approve payments owing
3 \$161,087.29. I move to approve that amount.

4 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Okay. There's a motion to
5 approve General Town Fund expenditures.

6 TRUSTEE ANDERSON: I'll second it.

7 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Trustee Anderson, thank
8 you very much.

9 If there's any discussion, please
10 advise.

11 (No response.)

12 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Clerk, please call the
13 roll.

14 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Imielski?

15 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: Aye.

16 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Anderson?

17 TRUSTEE ANDERSON: Aye.

18 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Mares?

19 TRUSTEE MARES: Aye.

20 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Cruz?

21 TRUSTEE CRUZ: Aye.

22 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Supervisor Getty?

23 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Yes. That is approved.

24 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: Moving on to the General

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1 Assistance Funds. I move to approve
2 expenditures in the amount of \$4,522.76. I move
3 to approve that amount.

4 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Okay. We have a motion.
5 Is there a second?

6 TRUSTEE CRUZ: I'll second.

7 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Trustee Cruz, thank you.

8 Clerk, please call the roll.

9 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Imielski?

10 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: Aye.

11 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Cruz?

12 TRUSTEE CRUZ: Aye.

13 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Mares?

14 TRUSTEE MARES: Aye.

15 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Anderson?

16 TRUSTEE ANDERSON: Aye.

17 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Supervisor Getty?

18 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Yes. It's approved.

19 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: Next, we have our road and
20 bridge. I move to approve funding in the amount
21 of \$66,737.23. I move to approve that amount.

22 SUPERVISOR GETTY: We have a motion. Is
23 there a second?

24 TRUSTEE MARES: I'll second.

1 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Trustee Mares, thank you.

2 Clerk, please call the roll.

3 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Imielski?

4 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: Aye.

5 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Mares?

6 TRUSTEE MARES: Aye.

7 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Anderson?

8 TRUSTEE ANDERSON: Aye.

9 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Cruz?

10 TRUSTEE CRUZ: Aye.

11 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Supervisor Getty?

12 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Yes. That is approved.

13 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: No motion for Special
14 Police Fund. No documents submitted this time
15 around.

16 So that concludes the Finance Committee
17 Report.

18 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Okay. Thank you very
19 much.

20 Moving on. Building and Maintenance.
21 We have no report. No action items there.

22 I will just mention that the Clerk had
23 brought up the bottle filler. She's speaking of
24 similar to, like, a water fountain at the main

1 level here. We did get one proposal. We are
2 seeking an additional proposal.

3 We'll continue to look at that and
4 update the Board as we move forward.

5 That's all I have for Building and
6 Maintenance.

7 Moving on to Senior Transportation.

8 Trustee Mares.

9 TRUSTEE MARES: No report.

10 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Thank you very much.

11 Committee on Youth. Trustee Cruz.

12 TRUSTEE CRUZ: Yes. So, again, our Lyons
13 Summer Youth Intern Program is starting up very
14 soon. So right now currently we do have
15 available application process until, correct me,
16 April 20th. So if you are interested, we do
17 have an on online link where you would apply.

18 And, again, it's open to all our
19 municipalities.

20 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Okay. Thank you very
21 much.

22 Mental Health Commission. Clerk.

23 CLERK HOFFENBERG: We've been very busy up in
24 Mental Health lately. I see my fellow

1 Commissioner, Barb Minneci, here. So good to
2 see her here.

3 We're finalizing our details on hosting
4 our first ever Lyons Mental Health Commission
5 Summer Camp. We'll be hosting it at Hope Church
6 over on Wolf Road in the LaGrange Highlands.

7 We anticipate a three-week camp for
8 grade school students that will incorporate
9 social and emotional learning, stem, and some
10 sustainability lessons.

11 We just hired a program community
12 social worker this week. She will work out of
13 the Township, but will be a resource to the
14 Township Community at large. Her name is Julie
15 Rule, and she'll be starting in May. She comes
16 to us from PCC Community Wellness.

17 She has previously hosted mindfulness
18 through coping skills workshops, and in addition
19 to bringing a background in journalism and grant
20 writing, which we believe will be very, very
21 helpful to our organization.

22 We have a service dog being trained
23 named Martha. She's doing great. She has a
24 couple more months of training before she's a

1 fully-certified facility dog.

2 A couple weeks ago, we celebrated our
3 first Fast Graduation for District 109, which is
4 Indian Springs in Justice and Bridgeview. It
5 was a tremendous success and very, very well
6 received by the community.

7 We've been piloting a tutoring pilot in
8 Indian Springs District 109 and Summit
9 District 104. It is doing pretty well, but we
10 have some challenges with that.

11 We have a bunch of programs that we've
12 added to our repertoire. We have something
13 called Life's Unplanned Road. We have Narcan
14 training. On April 24th we'll be hosting puppy
15 yoga at Argo. It filled up within minutes of
16 hitting the sign-up Genius. I believe we're
17 looking into hosting a second one because it was
18 so, so popular.

19 May 6th and June 3rd we'll be hosting
20 our Beautiful Sounds Workshop. May 7th we're
21 hosting a Lunch and Learn with NAMI that will
22 focus on mindfulness. May 11th we're hosting a
23 breakfast called the Movers and Shakers
24 Breakfast that's focused on neurodivergent

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1 family members.

2 May should see the beginning of our
3 Mama Luigi's program. We're hosting a senior
4 luncheon once a month in partnership with Aging
5 Care Connection. We're finalizing the dates.

6 We're also working to put together a
7 Township Family Pizza Night once a month also at
8 Mama Luigi's.

9 Dr. Crement has been working really
10 hard to put together something called a Mobile
11 Play Cafe in partnership with Birth to Five
12 Illinois. We anticipate having that up in the
13 next few months.

14 June 18th we'll be hosting a Lunch and
15 Learn in collaboration with NAMI that will
16 center on Why Language Matters.

17 And then also May 15th we're partnering
18 with the Justice, Summit, and Bridgeview Park
19 Districts to host a celebrating Memorial Day
20 event. It will feature a Vietnam Veteran who
21 will be speaking and a light lunch will be
22 served.

23 That's about it. Any questions?

24 (No response.)

1 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Very good. Thank you very
2 much.

3 Moving on to Special Police. Trustee
4 Anderson.

5 TRUSTEE ANDERSON: Yes. This will be the
6 Township of Lyons Police Report for March of
7 2026.

8 They had 275 cell-initiated premises
9 checks that were conducted; they had 40 assigned
10 premises checks that were conducted; and five
11 school premises checks.

12 That concludes my report.

13 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Okay. Thank you very
14 much.

15 At this time we'll move into Old
16 Business.

17 We have an Ordinance 2026-02. This is
18 the Responsible Bidder Ordinance. We got a
19 presentation last month at our last meeting by
20 the Iowa-Illinois-Indiana Foundation For Fair
21 Contracting which introduced this Ordinance to
22 the Board of Trustees.

23 At this time we would like it to be
24 considered by the Board. This will ensure

1 quality craftsmanship, quality workmanship,
2 efficient operation, safety, and also timely
3 completion of projects that are taken on by us
4 as a government agency.

5 This will be any type of Public Works
6 project that will be \$30,000 or more, in excess
7 of \$30,000. And so this is something that many
8 municipalities throughout the region have
9 considered and approved.

10 I'm recommending its adoption. I'm
11 happy to formally make the motion to approve the
12 Ordinance 2026-02 for the Responsible Bidder
13 Ordinance.

14 TRUSTEE ANDERSON: I'll second that.

15 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Thank you very much,
16 Trustee Anderson.

17 There's a motion to second.

18 Comments? Questions?

19 TRUSTEE ANDERSON: From me. I just want to
20 say I looked this over, did a lot of research.
21 It's right in our wheelhouse of good governance.
22 It's making sure taxpayer dollars are spent
23 respectfully.

24 This RBO may sound dry on paper, and it

1 does, but it has practical impact when I was
2 looking through this thing on cost, quality, and
3 accountability, and reduces the risk of cost
4 overruns, which is a really good thing.

5 And then it's not a deciding factor for
6 me to vote for this, or second this rather, but
7 I was watching the movie Armageddon with my
8 father-in-law. I don't know if everybody has
9 seen that movie.

10 And Steve Buscemi plays a driller that
11 goes to space. And when he's up there, he looks
12 at everybody and he's like, you know -- I got to
13 quote it. "You know, we're sitting on four
14 million pounds of fuel, one nuclear weapon, and
15 a thing that has 270,000 moving parts built by
16 the lowest bidder. ~~and it's all built by the~~ That makes you feel good,
17 doesn't it."

18 So it was, like, perfect timing to
19 watch that movie when I was researching this
20 thing. I'm, like, you know something? How
21 weird is that all made sense.

22 TRUSTEE MARES: Agreed.

23 TRUSTEE CRUZ: Well said.

24 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Any other comments or

1 questions?

2 (No response.)

3 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Clerk, please call the
4 roll.

5 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Supervisor Getty?

6 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Yes.

7 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Anderson?

8 TRUSTEE ANDERSON: Aye.

9 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Mares?

10 TRUSTEE MARES: Aye.

11 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Imielski?

12 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: Aye.

13 CLERK HOFFENBERG: Trustee Cruz?

14 TRUSTEE CRUZ: Aye.

15 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Okay. That is approved.
16 Thank you very much.

17 Is there any old or new business at
18 this time?

19 Hearing none.

20 Is there any public comment?

21 Yes, sir.

22 MR. MIKE SOCHACKI: I would like to make a
23 comment to the Road and Bridge.

24 I noticed a sign on Wolf Road that

1 there's going to be some roadwork. Is that what
2 you were talking about before?

3 HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER CARR: Yeah.

4 MR. MIKE SOCHACKI: From 87th to 91st?

5 HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER CARR: That's one of the
6 projects. There's projects throughout the whole
7 unincorporated --

8 MR. MIKE SOCHACKI: But on that Wolf Road
9 project, it is going to be just paving Wolf Road
10 from 87th to 91st or are you going to be doing
11 the side streets?

12 HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER CARR: We're not going
13 nowhere near your house. It stops right at the
14 side street there. So it doesn't go -- where
15 they stopped last time is where it's going to
16 start.

17 MR. MIKE SOCHACKI: So you're just going to
18 do Wolf Road then?

19 HIGHWAY COMMISSION CARR: Correct.

20 MR. MIKE SOCHACKI: Okay. Because a lot of
21 my neighbors were asking me. And I said, well,
22 I didn't know. Because they spotted the sign,
23 and so did I, but there was no other
24 information.

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1 Also, for the Road and Bridge, I
2 noticed in the culvert in front of the house,
3 you know, this past rain that we've had, a lot
4 of rain, it seems like the water is backing up.

5 Is there anyway you can throw some,
6 like, river rock over there to kind of make it
7 run -- the water run a little bit better. I
8 don't know if you have that in stock at the
9 town.

10 HIGHWAY COMMISSIONER CARR: We don't, but we
11 can look into that.

12 MR. MIKE SOCHACKI: Because, like I said,
13 when it rains real hard, it backs up. So I'm
14 just looking to see if the river rock might, you
15 know, make it run a little bit better.

16 Also, need the Village of Lyons to
17 reimburse the Township for the use of the senior
18 buses. Maybe the Board could get together and
19 make a motion. Because they're using the buses
20 after hours, so they're paying top dollar for
21 the drivers and stuff.

22 Just wanted to bring that up. I've
23 been asking for the past two, three meetings
24 about it.

1 And then, of course, we need a little
2 bit more police presence in the unincorporated
3 area there. So I'll make a comment about that.

4 And basically that's it. Thank you.

5 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Thank you, sir.

6 Any other public comment at this time?

7 (No response.)

8 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Okay. Do we have a motion
9 to Adjourn?

10 TRUSTEE IMIELSKI: So moved.

11 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Trustee Imielski. Is
12 there a second?

13 TRUSTEE CRUZ: I'll second.

14 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Trustee Cruz, thank you.

15 All those in favor please say aye.

16 ALL PRESENT: Aye.

17 SUPERVISOR GETTY: Meeting adjourned at 6:20.

18 The Annual Town Meeting will start
19 promptly at 7:00 p.m. Thank you.

20 (WHEREUPON, the proceedings
21 were concluded at 6:20 p.m.)
